



## CONCRETE

### Material craftsmanship – designing with concrete

Concrete, the classic material of discerning architecture, is now increasingly being used indoors. Concrete surfaces have a characteristic expression that is always entirely unique. Qualities that make this timeless material so precious for the design of individual kitchens.

Making a CONCRETE front requires expert craftsmanship: fine concrete is applied to a lacquered MDF base using the putty technique. This results in a unique, authentic surface appearance featuring structures with varying light refraction that make the kitchen front come alive. Matt-lacquer sealing ensures high durability. Three colour blends are available: a light one (manhattan), a dark one (brasilia) and a rust-coloured one (le havre).

In its puristic form, concrete is powerful within a room. In the kitchen shown, the dark grey furniture is the visual focus. The island rises up freely between the wide windows. The calm raster of the handle-less floor units is livened up by an asymmetric, almost fanciful system of wall shelves. At just 5 mm thick, the worktop made of hot-rolled steel is a particularly elegant contrast to the rough-looking concrete.
