



Kitchen architecture demonstrating the perfect harmony of shape, material and colour

This LEICHT kitchen is characterised by the fact that things have been reduced to essentials – it is a composition of symmetrically arranged matt glass fronts. Clarity is the name of the game and this bears witness to the company's understanding of homely purism.

The innovative Xtend+ design concept — an exclusive design development from LEICHT's very own Interior-Design-Studio — is used above the worktop. An aluminium system with individually lit shelves whose horizontal slats can be closed at the push of a button. This resolves the traditional trio arrangement of wall unit-niche-floor unit; whenever required, you can activate a calm, closed wall.

The warm grey tone of the glass fronts and the coordinating worktop exude harmony. The matt satin-finished glass with chamfered edges is particularly appealing as it is pleasantly soft to the touch and has visual depth. The symmetric joint spread of the floor units and tall units also contributes to the calm effect. The only irregular pattern is caused by the staggering of the illuminated shelves of the Xtend+ system with the rear panels in different colours. This deliberate "disturbance" of the order livens up the entire kitchen.
